IDENTIFICATION GUIDE CARRIE STEVENS STREAMER FLIES Four Dísplays, Tíed by Tom Trípí

The flies in these displays are representative of the types of Rangeley and Eastern style streamers Carrie Stevens designed and tied over her career from 1920 - 1956. The flies on the bottom row of Exhibit I are of particular note. The streamer on the bottom left is un-named, being an example of the first fly she designed and tied. The streamer at bottom center, also un-named, is an example of a fly she tied and used to catch her record six-pound 13-ounce Salvelinus fontinalis in 1924. The fly at bottom right is called "The Baby Brookie". It is the first of a few personal interpretations/designs in the displays, I tied to incorporate many of the techniques used in the Rangeley style of fly tying made famous by Carrie.

- 2. Early Spring Rangeley (Blossoms and leaves appear....but still snowing)
- 3. Heart of Spring (Everything is green....for a while)
- 4. Summer Rangeley (Bright blue skies, but color is already coming)
- 5. Late-summer Rangeley (subdued greens.....but fall colors are on the way!)
- 6. Late-Fall Rangeley (Cold returns, everything's brown, soon to be white)

Most flies are tied on hand made, size one, 10x long, heavy or medium heavy wire - Gaelic Supreme / Mike Martinek design hooks from Redditch, England. A few hooks are 1/0 10x long, with open eyes, hand-made in England by Partridge .
